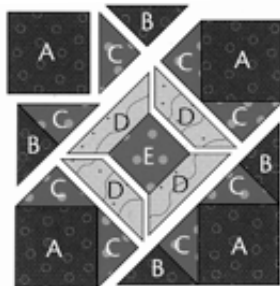
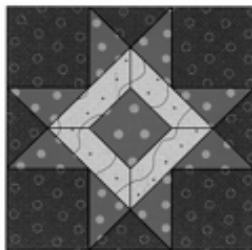

Our theme for this year's quilt is "At Home In Honesdale". I've picked blocks that remind me of things right here at home. This month's block is a Star and I've picked it in honor of Honesdale own Star on Irving Cliff! "Sew" let's get stitching on your own Honesdale memory quilt.

This quilt project can be scrappy using fabric from your own stash or you can decide on your own color palette. For instruction purposes I will list the fabrics as light, medium or dark.

**SUPPLIES:**

3 Fat Quarters of a coordinating light, medium and dark fabric

**DIRECTIONS:**

D = Light Fabric      C & E = Medium Fabric      A & B = Dark Fabric

You will be making a 12" square and for that, you will need to cut:

4 - 4 1/2" squares from fabric A (dark)

1 - 5 1/4" squares sub cut diagonally into 4 triangles from fabric B (dark)

2 - 5 1/4" squares sub cut diagonally twice into 8 triangles from fabric C (medium)

4 - 1 7/8 x 6 7/8" rectangles from fabric D (light)

1 - 3 3/8" square from fabric E (medium)

\*Please note this block utilizes Y-seam Piecing (fabric D to center square)

Use a 1/4 inch seam allowance



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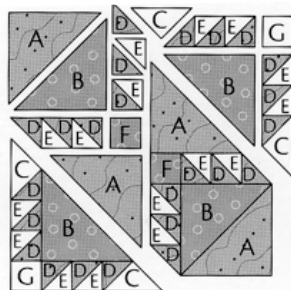
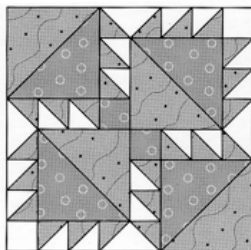

This quilt project can be scrappy using fabric from your own stash or you can decide on your own color palette. For instruction purposes I will list the fabrics as light, medium or dark.

### SUPPLIES:

3 Fat Quarters of a coordinating light, medium and dark fabric

### DIRECTIONS:

C, E, & G = Light Fabric    A & D = Medium Fabric    B & F = Dark Fabric

You will be making a 12" square and for that, you will need to cut:

- 2 - 5 3/8" squares sub cut diagonally into 4 triangles from fabric A (medium)
- 2 - 5 3/8" squares sub cut diagonally into 4 triangles from fabric B (dark)
- 1 - 4 1/4" squares sub cut diagonally twice into 4 triangles from fabric C (light)
- 12 - 2 3/8" square sub cut diagonally into 24 triangles from fabric D (medium)
- 8 - 2 3/8" squares sub cut diagonally into 16 triangles from fabric E (light)
- 2 - 2" squares from fabric F (dark)
- 2 - 2" squares from fabric G (light)

Use a 1/4 inch seam allowance



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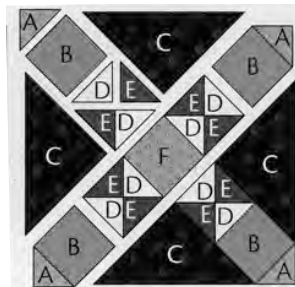
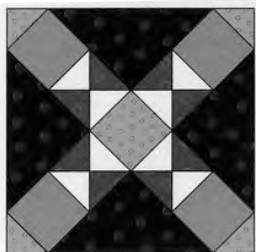

### SUPPLIES:

5 Fat Quarters of a coordinating light, medium and dark fabric

### DIRECTIONS:

D = Light Fabric    A & F = Medium Fabric    B = Medium Fabric (another color)

C = Dark Fabric    E = Dark Fabric (another color)

You will be making a 12” square and for that, you will need to cut:

2 - 2 ½” squares sub cut diagonally into 4 triangles from fabric A (medium)

4 - 3 ¾” squares from fabric B (medium)

1 - 9 ¼” square sub cut diagonally into 4 triangles from fabric C (dark)

4 - 2 ½” squares sub cut diagonally into 8 triangles from fabric D (light)

4 - 2 ½” squares sub cut diagonally into 8 triangles from fabric E (dark)

1 - 3 ¾” square from fabric F (medium)

Use a ¼ inch seam allowance



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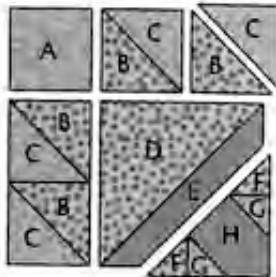
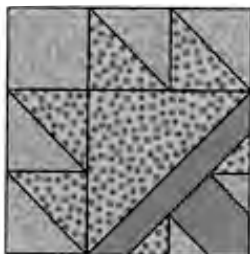

### SUPPLIES:

3 Fat Quarters of a coordinating light, medium and dark fabric

### DIRECTIONS:

A, C & G = Light Fabric B, D & F = Medium Fabric E & H = Dark Fabric  
You will be making a 12" square and for that, you will need to cut:

1-4 1/2 "squares from fabric A (light)

2-4 1/4 "squares sub cut diagonally once ( 4 triangles) fabric B (medium)

2-4 1/4 "squares sub cut diagonally once(4 triangles) fabric C (light)

1-8 1/2 "square sub cut diagonally once into 2 triangles from fabric D (medium)

1- 2 x 12 1/2" inch rectangle from fabric E (dark)

1- 2 1/2" square sub cut diagonally once into 2 triangles from fabric F (medium)

1- 2 1/2" square sub cut diagonally once into 2 triangles from fabric G (light)

1- 3 1/2 x 4 1/4 inch rectangle from fabric H (dark)

Use a 1/4 inch seam allowance



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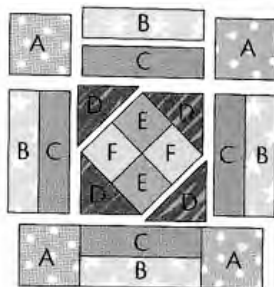
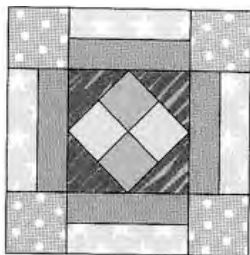

### DIRECTIONS:

A & E = Light Fabric C & F = Medium Fabric B & D = Dark Fabric

You will be making a 12" square and for that, you will need to cut:

- 4 - 3 1/2" squares from fabric A (light)
- 4 - 2 x 6 1/2" rectangles from fabric B (dark)
- 4 - 2 x 6 1/2" rectangles from fabric C (medium)
- 2 - 3 7/8" squares sub cut into 4 triangles from fabric D (dark)
- 2 - 2 5/8" squares from fabric E (light)
- 2 - 2 5/8" squares from fabric F (medium)

Use a 1/4 inch seam allowance



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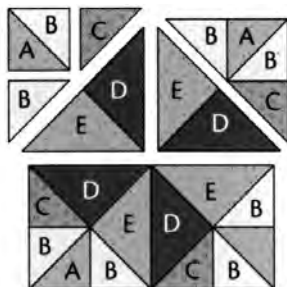
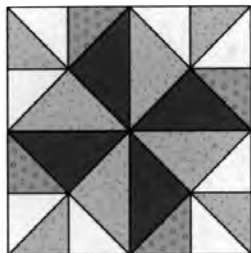

### SUPPLIES:

4 Fat Quarters of a coordinating light, medium and dark fabric

### DIRECTIONS:

B = Light Fabric    A, C, E = Medium Fabric    D = Dark Fabric  
You will be making a 12” square and for that, you will need to cut:  
2 – 3 7/8” squares cut into 4 triangles from fabric A (medium)  
4 – 3 7/8” squares cut into 8 triangles from fabric B (light)  
2 – 3 7/8” squares cut into 4 triangles from fabric C (medium)  
1 – 7 1/4” square cut twice diagonally into 4 triangles from fabric D (dark)  
1 – 7 1/4” square cut twice diagonally into 4 triangles from fabric E (medium)

Use a 1/4 inch seam allowance

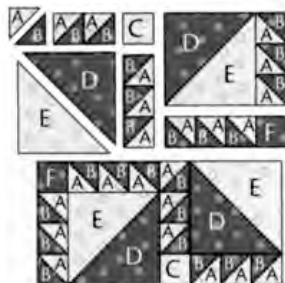

### SUPPLIES:

1 fat quarter light 1 fat quarter dark

### DIRECTIONS:

A, C, & E = Light Fabric B, D, & F = Dark Fabric

You will be making a 12" square and for that, you will need to cut:

- 12 - 2 3/8" squares sub cut into triangles (A)
- 12 - 2 3/8" squares sub cut into triangles (B)
- 2 - 2" squares (C)
- 2 - 5 3/8" squares sub cut into triangles (D)
- 2 - 5 3/8" squares sub cut into triangles (E)
- 2 - 2" squares (F)

Assemble according to the picture grid  
Use a 1/4 inch seam allowance



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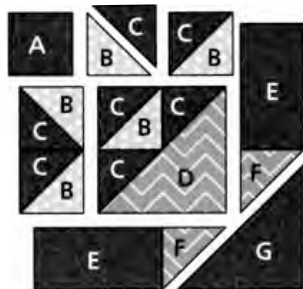

### SUPPLIES:

1 fat quarter light, 1 fat quarter medium, 1 fat quarter dark

### DIRECTIONS:

B = Light Fabric, D & F = Medium Fabric, A, C, E & G = Dark Fabric

You will be making a 12" square and for that, you will need to cut:

- 1 - 3 1/2" square (A)
- 4 - 3 7/8" squares sub cut into triangles (C)\*you will need 7 of these triangles
- 2 - 3 1/2" x 6 1/2" rectangles (E)
- 1 - 6 7/8" square sub cut into 2 triangles (G)
- 1 - 6 7/8" square sub cut into 2 triangles (D)
- 1 - 3 7/8" square sub cut into 2 triangles (G)
- 3 - 3 7/8" squares sub cut into triangles (B)\* you will need 5 of these triangles

Assemble according to the picture grid

Use a 1/4 inch seam allowance

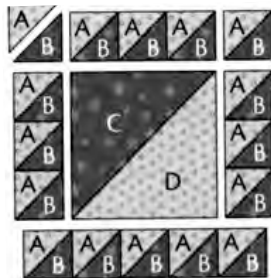
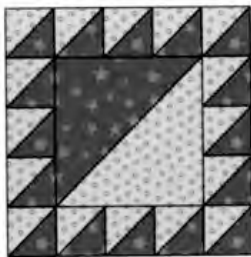

### SUPPLIES:

1 fat quarter light, 1 fat quarter dark

### DIRECTIONS:

A & D = Light Fabric B & C = Dark Fabric

You will be making a 12" square and for that, you will need to cut:

8 - 3 3/8" squares (A & D) Sub-cut into 16 half square triangles

1 - 8 3/8" square (A & D) Sub-cut once diagonally

8 - 3 3/8" squares (B & C) Sub-cut into 16 half square triangles

1 - 8 3/8" square (B & C) Sub-cut once diagonally

Assemble according to the picture grid

**Use a 1/4 inch seam allowance**

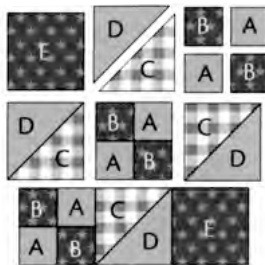
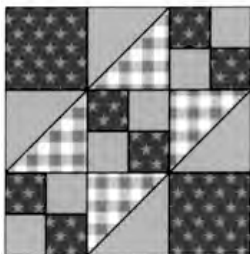

### DIRECTIONS:

A & D = Light Fabric C = Medium Fabric B & E = Dark Fabric  
You will be making a 12" square and for that, you will need to cut:

- 6 - 2 1/2" squares (A)
- 2 - 4 7/8" squares sub cut into 2 triangles (D)
- 2 - 4 7/8" squares sub cut into 2 triangles (C)
- 6 - 2 1/2" squares (B)
- 2 - 4 1/2" squares (E)

Assemble according to the picture grid

Use a 1/4 inch seam allowance

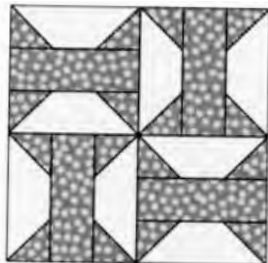
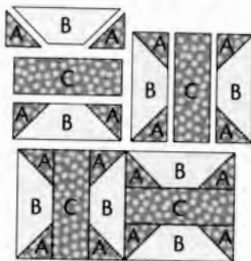

### SUPPLIES:

2 Fat Quarters of a coordinating light & dark fabric

### DIRECTIONS:

B = Light Fabric

A and C = Dark Fabric

**You will be making a 12" square and for that, you will need to cut:**

8 -  $2\frac{1}{8}$ " squares cut into 2 triangles from fabric A (dark)

4 -  $2\frac{1}{2} \times 6\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles from fabric C (dark)

8 -  $2\frac{1}{2} \times 7\frac{1}{4}$ " rectangles from fabric B (light)

For all 8 rectangles, lay 1 triangle (A) at each end and sew following the picture grid.

**Use a 1/4 inch seam allowance**

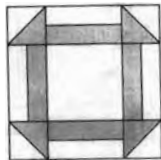
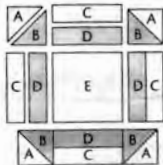

**SUPPLIES:**

2 Fat Quarters of a coordinating light & dark fabric

**DIRECTIONS:**

A, C and E = Light Fabric

B and D = Dark Fabric

**You will be making a 12" square and for that, you will need to cut:**

2 - 3<sup>7</sup>/<sub>8</sub>" squares cut into 4 triangles from fabric A (light)

4 - 2x6<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" rectangles from fabric A (light)

2 - 3<sup>7</sup>/<sub>8</sub>" squares cut into 4 triangles from fabric B (dark)

4 - 2x6<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" rectangles from fabric D (dark)

**Follow the picture grid to put your square together.**

**Use a 1/4 inch seam allowance**
